As you will have seen, if you have driven past the Abbeyfield House in Wills Road, the build is progressing and looking great. The windows are in and they are working on the roof. It is hard to imagine, but come early October, our house will be ready to occupy.

There is lots to do before we get to open the house, and the committee is working hard to put things into place. The landscaping will be an important step and thanks to Ellite Garden Design and Landscaping, we have a great landscape plan. Part of the plan will be the eleven Garden stakes the Katikati Art Society Members painted and donated to Abbeyfield and have been sponsored. These will be a prominent feature in the front of the house.

We have two stakes left to sponsor, in return for a \$5,000 sponsorship the name of your choice will go on the Stake to acknowledge your donation. Let either Natasja or Carole know if you would like to sponsor one of the last two stakes.

Once it comes to the landscaping, we will be keen to have some volunteers come and join us with the planting.

Fundraising

We are progressing really well raising the last of the money we need for the house. We only need a further \$79,601 to reach the goal of \$280,000 we set ourselves in February last year.

The recent Annah Stretton event raised \$3345.00 with the Claymark Ambrose Golf tournament raising a further \$5368.00

Over the last three years we were lucky to have had fine weather for three of the annual golf fundraising tournaments and this year, the weather had other plans. The weather was moody and wet for the Claymark Ambrose Golf Fundraising Tournament at the Waihi Beach Golf Club 4th April. We are truly grateful and appreciated that 100 dedicated players played on the day in not the most ideal weather and

sticking it out and supporting our cause. The 18-hole game was reduced to 9- holes due to worsening weather predicted after lunch.
