KATIKATI ABBEYFIELD HOUSE – Newsletter

July 2025

Wow, June seemed to just disappear and its July already. The Committee is busy working on all the tasks to complete the house, get setup ready to run the house and for residents to move in as soon as possible after we get the Code of Compliance.

Moving forward to the opening of the house

We have a completion date for the house for the beginning of October. With the cladding now completed, the builders are working inside putting up the linings. Moreover, finalising outside drains and all sorts of other bits and pieces that need to happen at this stage of the build.

Once the builders have completed the hard landscaping, we will be planting out the gardens, although there is minimal space around the house it will still enable us to have a lovely garden. Ally from Ellite Garden Design and Landscaping along with Everdien de Graaf have created a wonderful plan for our garden which will include the fabulous Stakes created by Katikati Art Society members. It will also have a water feature which has been donated. We are currently sourcing plants, compost and mulch for the garden.

We need volunteers, lots of volunteers to help with the planting and setup of the gardens. Contact Carole if you would like to be involved. We will provide plenty of food and drinks and be extremely grateful for any amount of time you are able to give to help. The planting will be under Ally's supervision.

We have a small team of three, two Committee members and one community person who are working through the applications from people who would like to be residents in the house. It involves completing a full application form, meeting with the team for an interview, and a medical certificate. The medical information is provided to our Honorary Doctor who reviews it and ensures that the applicant would be able to live independently in the house. The medical information is confidential to our Doctor. All successful applicants will be notified by the end of September.

This is not an easy task, as it must be remembered that the 14 residents will in effect be flatting together and it is important that they are compatible and able to get along with others in a shared environment.

We are still accepting applications from possible residents who would like to move into the house once it opens. We will continue to accept applications for residency in the house so when a studio becomes available in the future, we can offer it to an applicant. Once we have Code of Compliance, we will be able to have people move into the house. Hopefully this will be mid-October.

We are currently advertising for Housekeepers - a full time housekeeper who works five days and a part timer who does two. We are happy to negotiate specific hours. They will prepare the meals and care for the shared areas in the house.

We are also preparing for whiteware and furniture to go into the house in the shared communal areas. Residents will furnish their studio with their own furniture and treasures. We are also finalising furniture and other requirements to furnish the shared communal areas.

Once the house is built, the Committee, who has worked hard to raise the funds to build the house and has done everything required to get us to this stage, will become the Executive Committee responsible for the Governance of the house. From the Executive Committee there will be a sub-committee who will be responsible for the day-to-day running of the house, it will include a House Manager, Applications Officer, Compliance Officer, and a Funding/Promotion Officer. This committee will report monthly to the Executive Committee. All positions will be voluntary.

The Executive Committee are responsible for setting the society's strategic direction and providing leadership and vision to ensure the house is fully occupied and providing a quality service to residents. Committee members ensure the society is solvent, well run and delivering the objectives for which it was set up.

We have begun planning for the Official Opening of the house and will let people know when that will be once we have finalised details. At this stage it will be in November.

One of the big tasks that Committee members, Janet and Pauline have taken on is to prepare a list of all the items we need for our kitchen. Remembering the Abbeyfield Kitchen needs to function like a commercial kitchen with the housekeeper preparing 14 meals twice a day, it is important that we have the right things in the kitchen so the housekeeper can do her/his job. We also have to abide by the Food Safety legislation and once a year we will be audited.

Our Kitchen Gift list has been a popular way for people to donate items. We want to ensure that we get top quality utensils, appliances and equipment so that it will last so we do not have to constantly be replacing items. It is going to be a big task to resource all those items and set up the kitchen.

Another Brick in the Wall and Katikati Sunday Farmers Market






